The aim of this funding is to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE that is offered.

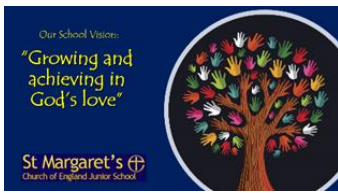
The focus of this premium is to:

There are 5 key indicators that schools should work towards:

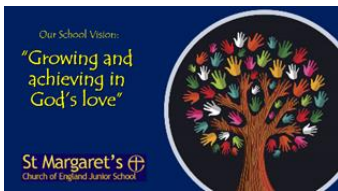
1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.

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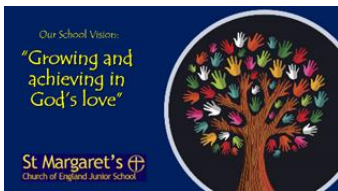


Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety July 2022	
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort swims competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	66%

What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	45%
