Breakdown of expenditure		
Initiative	Spend	Impact
Support funding of swimming coaches at local leisure centre through the year	£5000	Children to develop the ability to swim at least 25 metres. They have had opportunity of another sport that cannot be offered with our own school's facilities.
Howard Schools Sports Partnership	£1150	Children have had the opportunity to participate in competitions. Staff who attended the CPD training have developed their knowledge on effective PE practice and have shared the resources with other staff members.
Curriculum equipment purchase	£450	New PE resources were brought to enhance opportunities for children to participate within lessons and school clubs. Old equipment was either restored or replaced (if necessary).
Supply cover for staff leading MYG's and competitions	£820	Children received quality PE lessons from a trained instructor when adults were offsite for residential and competitions.
Holiday clubs	£500	Children had the opportunity during half term to engage in a range of activities that they may not have had the opportunity for at home. Fine motor skills were also developed through other activities such as arts and craft.
Specialist in-house sports coach	£2900	Children received high quality PE lessons developing their skills and knowledge. Staff also benefitted working alongside the sports coach to develop their knowledge and confidence in delivery.
Specialist external sports coach	£450	Coaches came in to deliver after school clubs in sports such as badminton and hockey to enable children to gain a better understanding of the skills involved.
To provide additional equipment for sporting activities during lunch breaks	£150	Children have the opportunity to be active during lunchtime using the equipment provided. By providing equipment, play leaders were able to promote participation at lunchtime. This increased the opportunity to participate in structured activities at playtime.
